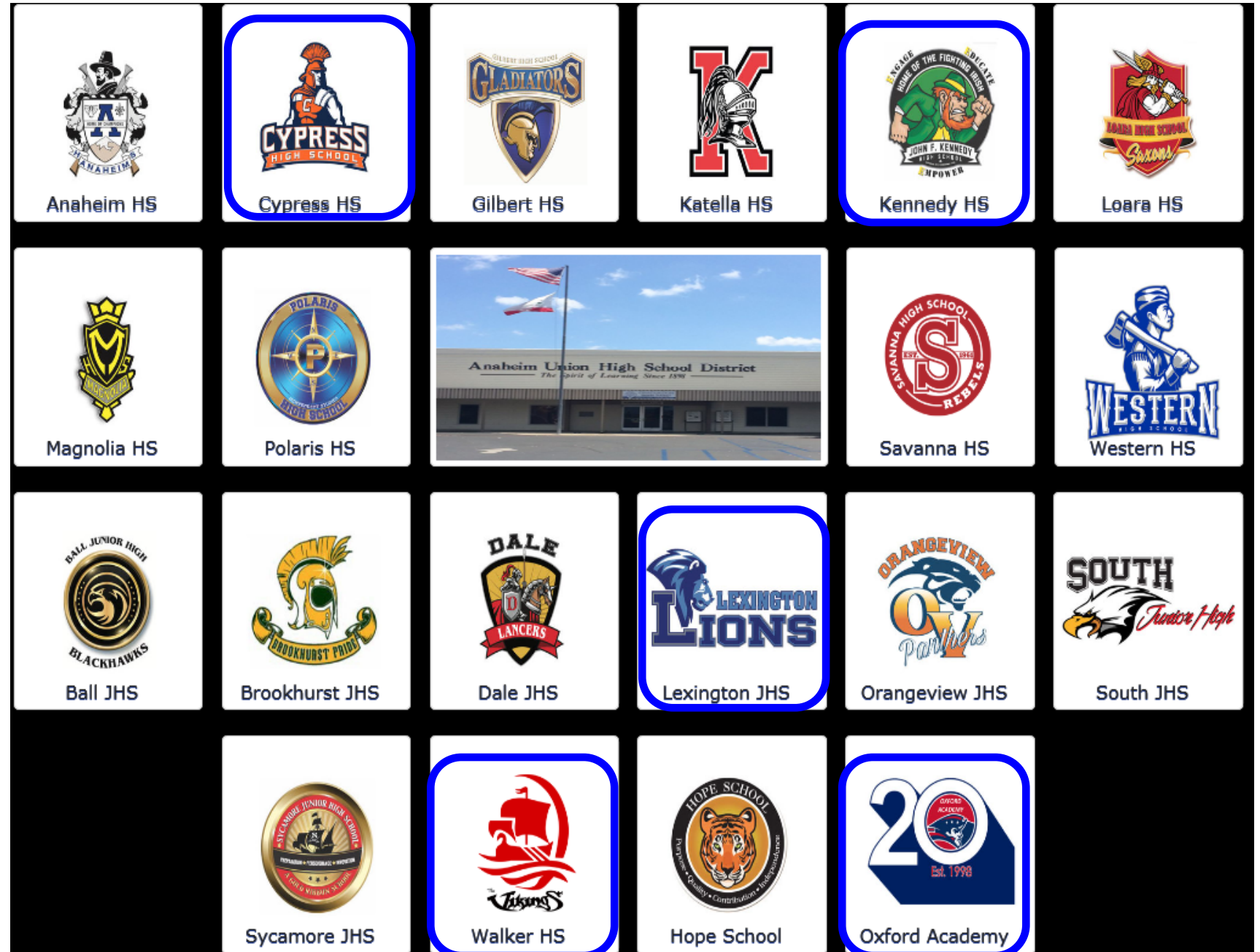

## HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS/STANDARDS OF PROFICIENCY

Students shall receive diplomas of graduation from Dublin High School upon completing the required course of study and meeting the standard of proficiency established by the District. Students must complete at least 230 credits in a six-period instructional day over a four-year period. The minimum requirements for graduation from Dublin High School shall be:

English- 40 credits

Mathematics- 30 credits  
(Must include Algebra and Geometry and one other math course)

Science- 30 credits  
(Must include Biology, any Physics class, and Chemistry or Earth Science)

Social Science- 30 credits  
(World History, US History, and Civics/Economics)

Physical Education- 20 credits (Freshman PE is required)

Health- 5 credits

World Language- 20 credits  
(May include one year of middle school and one year of high school - no high school credit is given for a world language taken in middle school, but it validates first year world language)

Visual/Performing/Applied Arts- 10 credits

Electives- 45 credits

**Total 230 credits**

## Four-Year Plan and College Requirements

### Community College Requirement

California residents are eligible to apply for admission to a community college if they are high school graduates, or if they are over 18 years of age and not a high school graduate, they may be admitted on probation. If you are interested in completing the Transfer Program in a community college to a university, we recommend that you follow a 4-year college plan, including maintaining minimum grades of "C" in all college preparatory courses..

## E) Language other than English

### UC-approved high school courses

a- History/Social Science - 2 years required, 3 years recommended  
Two years of history/social science providing fundamental knowledge in two of these three foundational subjects: U.S. history or one-half year of world history and one-half year of world geography.

b- English - 4 years required, 5 years recommended  
Four years of college-preparatory English, including one year of advanced English and one year of modern literature. No more than two years of college-preparatory English may be used to fulfill this requirement.

c- Mathematics - 3 years required, 4 years recommended  
Three years of college-preparatory mathematics, including one year of advanced mathematics and two- and three-dimensional geometry. No more than two years of college-preparatory mathematics may be used to fulfill this requirement, as may no more than one year of mathematics taken in the seventh and eighth grades. Courses taken to its own math course.

d- Laboratory Science - 2 years required, 3 years recommended  
Two years of laboratory science providing fundamental knowledge in two of these three foundational subjects: biology, chemistry, or physics. Advanced laboratory science classes that have biology, chemistry or physics as prerequisites and cover substantial additional material may be used to fulfill this requirement. The final two years of an approved three-year integrated science program may be used to fulfill this requirement.

e- Language other than English - 2 years required, 3 years recommended  
Two years of the same language other than English. Courses should emphasize speaking and understanding, and include instruction in grammar, vocabulary, reading, composition and culture. Courses in languages other than English taken in the seventh and eighth grades may be used to fulfill part of this requirement if your high school accepts them as equivalent to its own courses.

f- Visual and Performing Arts (VPA) - 1 year required  
A single yearlong approved arts course from a single VPA discipline: dance, drama/theater, music or visual art.

g- College Preparatory Electives - 1 year required  
One year (two semesters), in addition to those required in "a-f" above, chosen from the following areas: visual and performing arts (non-introductory level courses), history, social science, English, advanced mathematics, laboratory science and language other than English (a third year in the language used for the "e" requirement or two years of another language).

Two years, or equivalent to the 2nd level of high school instruction, of the same language other than English are required. (Three years/3rd level of high school instruction recommended). Courses should emphasize speaking and understanding, and include instruction in grammar, vocabulary, reading, composition and culture. American Sign Language and classical languages, such as Latin and Greek, are acceptable. Courses taken in the seventh and eighth grades may be used to fulfill part or all of this requirement if the high school accepts them as equivalent to its own courses.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETION OF:

### Application For Authorization For World Language Elective Credit

#### TO THE STUDENTS:

Before filling out this application, please read the following carefully.

1. Credit for world language instruction received in private schools after a student has completed grade eight (8) may be granted as described below:
  - o Maximum credit granted shall not exceed ten (10) credits per year for work taken during the time the pupil was in attendance in grades 9-12 at an Anaheim Union High School District high school.
  - o Credit for world language instruction granted on the basis of the procedures herein described may be used for acceleration purposes only when the program has been approved.
  - o Only world language elective credit will be granted.
  - o Courses taken off campus will not meet the Anaheim Union High School District world language or visual performing art requirement.
  - o Students enrolled in both regular campus programs and private school instruction shall not earn more than 40 credits total per semester.
  - o Students with a total GPA below 3.0 do not qualify for this program. Part I of the application must be filled out at the school site and approved prior to enrollment and district guidelines followed.
2. If you decide to apply for credit, you must:
  - o Fill out Part I of the application carefully and completely. Note that your application must include the exact title and level of the course, or courses, for which you desire the credit. (i.e. Japanese 1, Korean 2)
  - o Return your application to the principal of your private school.
  - o Pass an examination which demonstrates that you are able to understand, speak, read and write the world language at the level of proficiency which is required of pupils who have completed a comparable course, or courses, in the Anaheim Union High School District.
  - o Upon completion of the course, the private school is to mail to the high school:
    - The completed authorization of credit form (Part II) with completed exam and grade.
    - An official course description of the course taken
    - Evidence of school accreditation and/or school's current UC a-g list
    - A sealed official transcript that includes the grade issued and credits earned and completed exam attached and grade.

## TO THE PRINCIPALS OF PRIVATE SCHOOLS:

You are requested to observe the following procedures relative to applications and examinations:

3. Certify Part I of the application and authorization form that the student enrolling in a world language course, or courses, for which he/she is eligible to receive credit.

\*\*Note: Students enrolled in both regular campus programs and private school instruction shall not earn more than 40 total credits per semester.
4. Administer the written examination(s) to the student. Attach a copy of the completed examination(s) showing final examination grade.
5. The course and written examination(s) must academically meet the UC entrance requirements and the A-F/G scale.
6. Certify in Part II of the application form that the student satisfactorily passed an examination and is eligible to receive credit. Credit must be recorded in terms of completion of equivalent courses in the Anaheim Union High School District; therefore the course titles should correspond to those used in the district. (e.g., first year Spanish is Spanish 1).
7. Part I of the application must be filed and approved prior to enrollment. District guidelines must be followed.
8. Upon completion of the course, the private school is to mail to the high school:
  - The completed authorization of credit form (Part II) An official course description of the course taken
  - Evidence of school accreditation and/or school's current UC a-g list
  - A sealed official transcript that includes the grade issued and credits earned and completed exam attached and grade.
  - no later than May 1 of the current school year.

## TO COUNSELORS AT SENIOR HIGH SCHOOLS:

9. Students enrolled in both regular campus programs and private school instruction shall not earn more than 40 total credits per semester.
10. The principal will grant such credit based on his/her determination of whether the course or experience is equivalent in time and content to similar courses in the AUHSD Course Catalog.
11. School site personnel will list the course, credit granted, and appropriate grade on the student's transcript.
12. The completed application and authorization of credit form (Part I and II) will be turned in to the counselor no later than the first day of May of the current school year. Additional documentation must also be submitted.
  - An official course description of the course taken
  - Evidence of school accreditation and/or school's current UC a-g list
  - A sealed official transcript that includes the grade issued and credits earned and completed exam attached and grade
